#### General

Use this form to notify DUO of your income. We will then take your income as a basis for calculating your new monthly instalments. It is possible that you may have to pay less, or even nothing at all. If you live in the Netherlands, you should fill in the form <a href="Income statement to reduce monthly repayment 2026">Income statement to reduce monthly repayment 2026</a>.

#### Repayment rules

Not everyone is subject to the same repayment regulations. To fill in this form correctly, you will need to know if you are subject to the repayment regulations SF15-old or not. In Mijn DUO, under 'Mijn Schulden' (My debt), you can find which repayment rules apply to you. #### Date of commencement

Use this form to notify us of your income, so that we can calculate your monthly instalments for calendar year 2026.

If you make your request before 1 January, any reduction of the monthly instalments will commence from 1 January 2026. If you submit this form after 1 January 2026, the monthly instalments will commence from the month following your request.

If you live in the Caribbean Netherlands or on Curaçao, we will try to obtain information about your income automatically. Should we fail to receive the information, we will contact you. In that case, you will have to send the income details yourself.

### Note on 2.6 Including your partner's income

If you are repaying your student loan in compliance with the repayment rules SF15, SF35 or SF15-lllk, you are obliged to include your partner's income so that your monthly payment can be calculated. If the repayment rules of SF15-old apply to you and you have a partner or partner for tax purposes, you can decide not to include your partner's income. In that case you will only need to fill in question 2.6 when answering question 2. Have you decided not to include your partner's income? In that case, you are obliged to continue the repayments until you have paid off your student debt in full. Your repayment period will last longer as a result. Do you have a lifelong learning credit debt and a student debt subject to the regulations SF15-old? And have you decided not to include your partner's income? In that case, your partner's income must be included in your lifelong learning credit debt. You can specify your partner's details and income details using this form.

## Note on 3 Single parent

If you live alone with a child aged under 18, an additional income exemption applies for the purpose of calculating the monthly

instalments. This means that a larger share of your income is excluded in the calculation of your monthly instalments.

Conditions for this additional exemption:

- You care for a child aged under 18 who is registered at the same address for at least six months of the year, and
- No other adults are registered at this address.

#### Note on 3 Income statement

Please include proof of your income with your application. This may include:

- An income statement from the tax authorities.
- Form Statement Income tax from DUO signed by the local tax authorities. The supporting documents must be signed and stamped by the local tax autorities.

#### Note on 4 Fall in income

Has your income or your joint income over 2025 or 2026 fallen by at least 15% since 2024? In that case, DUO can use your income of 2025 or 2026 for its calculation. To calculate your ability to pay, DUO uses your taxable income, not your reduced spendable income. DUO does not take into account an increase in expenses such as higher rents or increased daily living expenses.

#### Note on 5 Income estimate

Fill in the aggregate income in the currency of the island where the income was received. That income must be evidenced by the supporting documents you send. DUO then converts the income into euros based on the annual exchange rate set by De Nederlandsche Bank. If you did not have any income, please enclose a signed statement detailing how you supported yourself that year.

#### Note on 6.2 Annual payments

As you live outside of the Netherlands, you can opt to make your repayment once a year. You will pay twelve times your monthly instalment in one lump sum. You will bear responsibility yourself for ensuring that you pay the full amount on time. The full amount for 2026 must be paid to DUO before 31 December 2026.

Once we have processed your request, you will be registered as an annual payer from the following month. That applies for the remaining monthly payments of 2026. Overdue monthly instalments will not be included in the annual payment. You will still need to repay those sums.
